4. Old Business

- A. Energy Update – Giezie not present; no briefing given. Col Bartman did discuss that Toledo Edison's main feed has changed and we will now get a better picture of what energy each building is using and what their peak hours are.
- B. Late Appraisals – Col Bartman delivered a stack of appraisals to the State. There are currently only 2 or 3 on the late list. An updated listing will be out soon. Leimenstoll stressed the importance of getting appraisals accomplished before going to AEF. This does not have to be done but if they are not accomplished by the due date, a waiver will be required.

C. Drinking Policy – What is the existing policy/process for handling employees who come back to work impaired? Col Bartman stated that Lt Scott will have minutes to detail the AIR PEC meeting. Col Bartman did state that the JAG said it is legal to test someone that is under suspicion of being under the influence of alcohol. The Army has a program, Air would need to set one up and legally that can be done.

D On Hold:

- a. Repairing Smoke Shacks – Giezie; won't be addressed until October.

- c. Labor/Management CoP – getting info out to Base - awaiting action until policies are reviewed/updated

E. Fuel Conservation Ideas –

a. Zimmerman – volunteered to contact Selfridge and then some dealers to see if they would possibly provide test vehicles. No information yet, Zimmerman has called many times but no call has been returned as of today. Will keep trying. Zimmerman brought up the fact that his bobtails are still going back and forth from munitions many times daily. Perhaps a staging area can be set up. Will talk to Safety to see if this is a possibility.

b. Masiker – looking into the following: JP8 used elsewhere (i.e. Hush House, AGE) – are getting billed to flying bill – why can't we use the same hand pump to help out against the money used from O&M? Creps and Smith are working JP8 conversion issue. Masiker did not want to discuss it any further, it is between Creps and Smith. The budget for energy will be cut, period. Bikes are being used and next month Masiker will have a report of the Top 10 Vehicles as far as gas usage.

Col August will be meeting with the remaining individuals left in the Baker Building to see what the possibilities are for those individuals. The only issue with the
