

## JPEC Minutes

21 Sep 2006 Lunch 1200-1300 Meeting 1300-1600

Location: Houlihan's, 3580 W. Dublin-Granville Rd. (1 mile west of Beightler on the right)

<u>Item</u>	<u>Purpose</u>
1. <i>Previous Minutes</i>	<i>Review</i>
Minutes from the 5 July 2006 JPEC meeting were reviewed and accepted.	
2. <i>Service PEC's</i>	<i>Update</i>
Discussion: Lt. Roche provided an update of the 17 August 2006 ARPEC and APEC meetings. It was clarified that the November ARPEC is expected to be for all Army LPC members statewide. It was also decided that in place of a joint letter from the ATAG-Army and the Union Pres a letter to be signed by the JPEC would be drafted for the partnership website (see Item 4).	
3. <i>Joint Motor Traffic Regulation</i>	<i>Discuss</i>
Discussion: An information paper outlining the provisions of the regulation was provided. Labor is concerned about the manning, training and cost issues associated with implementation, and initially recommends the approaching implementation locally as a safety issue. Management is also concerned with the same issues, and would prefer a legal review before taking any further steps.	
Action: Refer to LTC Aukland for legal review of AR 190-5, AFI 31-218(I) regarding jurisdiction, distinctions between state and federal property, and distinctions between types of employees (excepted and competitive technicians, AGRs, traditional members and state employees). Implementation is on hold pending legal review. Presentation to be scheduled at the next JPEC.

4. <i>Assessment Subcommittee</i>	<i>Discuss</i>
Discussion: An information paper was provided for background. Concerns of the group at large were that assessments not create unnecessary additional work for LPCs; that they be a tool to foster success rather than assign blame; and that they be identical in design and process for Army and Air.	
Action: An Assessment Subcommittee was named as follows: COL Faber, Col. Baylor, Greg Shafer & Clint Byington. The group is charged to develop a recommendation for an assessment tool and process for use in partnership councils pursuant to Article 2 Sec 3.e. of the Collective Bargaining Agreement. The Subcommittee may communicate its recommendations during the next JPEC meeting, or earlier via email if so desired.

5. <i>Partnership Website</i>	<i>Update</i>
Discussion: The Partnership website structure has been built and is available to view in its developmental phase for Army users at <a href="http://ngoh-j6---c20b/OhioPartnership/Default.htm">http://ngoh-j6---c20b/OhioPartnership/Default.htm</a> . Air users can not see the site at this time. If Air users want to see the site, labor Relations can	

forward screen prints. The JPEC ran through a demonstration of the site and approved its general structure and layout. Upon finalization of the content, the site will be published as a hidden page on OhioNationalGuard.com, where it can be viewed publicly.

Action: Labor Relations will finalize content additions to the site and publish NLT 15 Oct 06.

6. *L-M Training* *Update*

Discussion: Since the 17 August Service PEC meetings, each LPC has certified their membership and training status. A summary of this information was provided, showing 17 LPC members who need training as follows: 121ARW-1, 178 FW-0, 179AW-3, 180 FW-5, AASF1-3, AASF2-0, CSMS-2, East/West-3. One facilitator also needs training.

Action: Based on dispersion, the group agreed to support a training date for these individuals at the 178<sup>th</sup> AW in Mansfield as soon as possible. Labor Relations will establish a mutually acceptable date for the training. This information in the Partnership will be displayed in the future with previously agreed upon (5 July 06) Partnership Metric data.

7. *Budget* *Update*

Discussion: Dean Boling discussed the state budget. We have received roughly \$1M more in the state budget this for the State FY beginning July 1 2006 compared to last year. Currently, we appear on track to be within budget. A 6% increase in utilities cost was assumed for this year over last year. We are currently below usage and cost for utilities compared to last year, however, gas cost is up compared to last year.
